**DEFENDANT'S RECIPROCAL DISCOVERY SUBMISSION PURSUANT TO FL. R. Cr.
P. 3.220(d)**

COMES NOW the Defendant, JOSEPH TURNER, by and through his undersigned
Counsel and files this Reciprocal Discovery Submission Pursuant to FL. R. Cr. P. 3.220:

Witnesses (Category A):

Custodian of Records, Walton County.

Documents:

1. Signed statement by Charles Galloway stating that he had completed the Walton County New Hire Orientation and other requirements, that he agreed to adhere to and obey all policies set forth and adopted by the Board Of County Commissioners
2. Signed statement by Charles Galloway that he had received the Walton County Employee Handbook and had read it.
3. Walton County Employee Handbook, Policy 2.23 Equipment Usage, which states in part:

An employee shall not use the equipment assigned to them to conduct work for themselves or another entity

Equipment assigned to employees is subject to monitoring. There should not be any expectation of privacy with respect to the use of such equipment. Additionally, employees may be asked to surrender the equipment with no notice for a variety of reasons, including routine maintenance.

4. One representative email from a Charles Galloway email list, the body of which is 106 pages of content that includes the following statements/assertions:
 - a. Accuses Walton County Resident Suzanne Harris of having Munchhausen-by-Proxy Disorder and of being the anti Christ.
 - b. Suggests Dan Curry will be removed from office, be fined, or is going to jail for recently "cheating" in an election.
 - c. States that a Barbara Marano is being pressured into "not dropping" the criminal charges against him (Charles Galloway)
 - d. States that FDLE officer Keith Riddick, the lead investigator, told him (Galloway) on or by September 2024 that both Quinn Robertson and Joseph Turner would be pleading guilty to felonies.
 - e. States that County Commissioner Boots McCormick is racist and regularly uses racial slurs, specifically that he "says the N-word every day, and he doesn't even like hip-hop music, so he can't blame it on that.
 - f. Refers to a Todd Roark as a "fairy boy."
 - g. Refers to himself as a 30A songwriter having released a song against Barbara Morano, who happens to be the complaining victim in an (at the time) current prosecution wherein Mr. Galloway was the listed defendant.

h. Suggests Brad Drake, another listed victim in the criminal mischief case, may also go to jail.

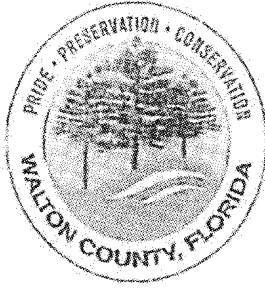

Policy 2.23 – Equipment Usage

The Walton County BCC has made a tremendous investment in our facilities and equipment to better serve the citizens of Walton County and to make our jobs easier. Equipment such as laptops, cell phones, projectors, MIFIs, etc., may be assigned to employees to facilitate their service to Walton County.

Except for the property/equipment specifically assigned to employees for such purposes, no other property or equipment may be removed from the premises without the permission of the Department Director or County Administration.

An employee's computer may be the most valuable item assigned to them. As well as being expensive to replace physically, your computer may contain valuable and sensitive data.

An employee shall not use the equipment assigned to them to conduct work for themselves or another entity.

Equipment assigned to employees is subject to monitoring. There should not be any expectation of privacy with respect to the use of such equipment. Additionally, employees may be asked to surrender the equipment with no notice for a variety of reasons including routine maintenance.

Employees are responsible for the safekeeping of any Walton County BCC owned equipment or property that is in their possession. Careless disregard for proper care and safekeeping may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of their employment.

Requirements for safeguarding equipment assigned to employees includes protecting it from theft. Some general guidelines are:

- Employees shall always remove equipment from a vehicle when the vehicle is parked in a public location such as a restaurant or hotel
- Never leave equipment in a vehicle overnight
- Do not remove any inventory or property marking tags
- Do not remove or disable any protective software
- Use strong passwords to protect the information stored on your computer
- Use an uninterruptible power supply, when possible, so that blackouts, brown-outs, and electricity spikes don't harm your equipment
- Do not place liquids, magnets, or hot items near your equipment
- If equipment assigned to you needs repair, report it to your supervisor immediately

An employee who has been provided Walton County BCC property or equipment such as tools, vehicles, materials, uniforms, etc., is expected to exercise reasonable care in the use and preservation of such equipment and to observe all safety precautions while carrying out the assigned work.

Walton County BCC property shall be used exclusively for the benefit of Walton County and in accordance with the directives of County Administration, department directors, and supervisors. Personal or other non-county use of Walton County BCC owned vehicles, materials, supplies, tools, or

any other county property is not permitted. Violations may result in prosecution, or other disciplinary action, up to and including termination of their employment.

All operators of Walton County BCC owned vehicles and equipment must hold a valid and appropriate license. Employees are required to inform their supervisors of any change of status in their license. Suspension or revocation of an employee's license may necessitate the demotion or discharge of an employee assigned to the operation of county owned vehicles and equipment (see **Policy 2.22 – Driver's License**).

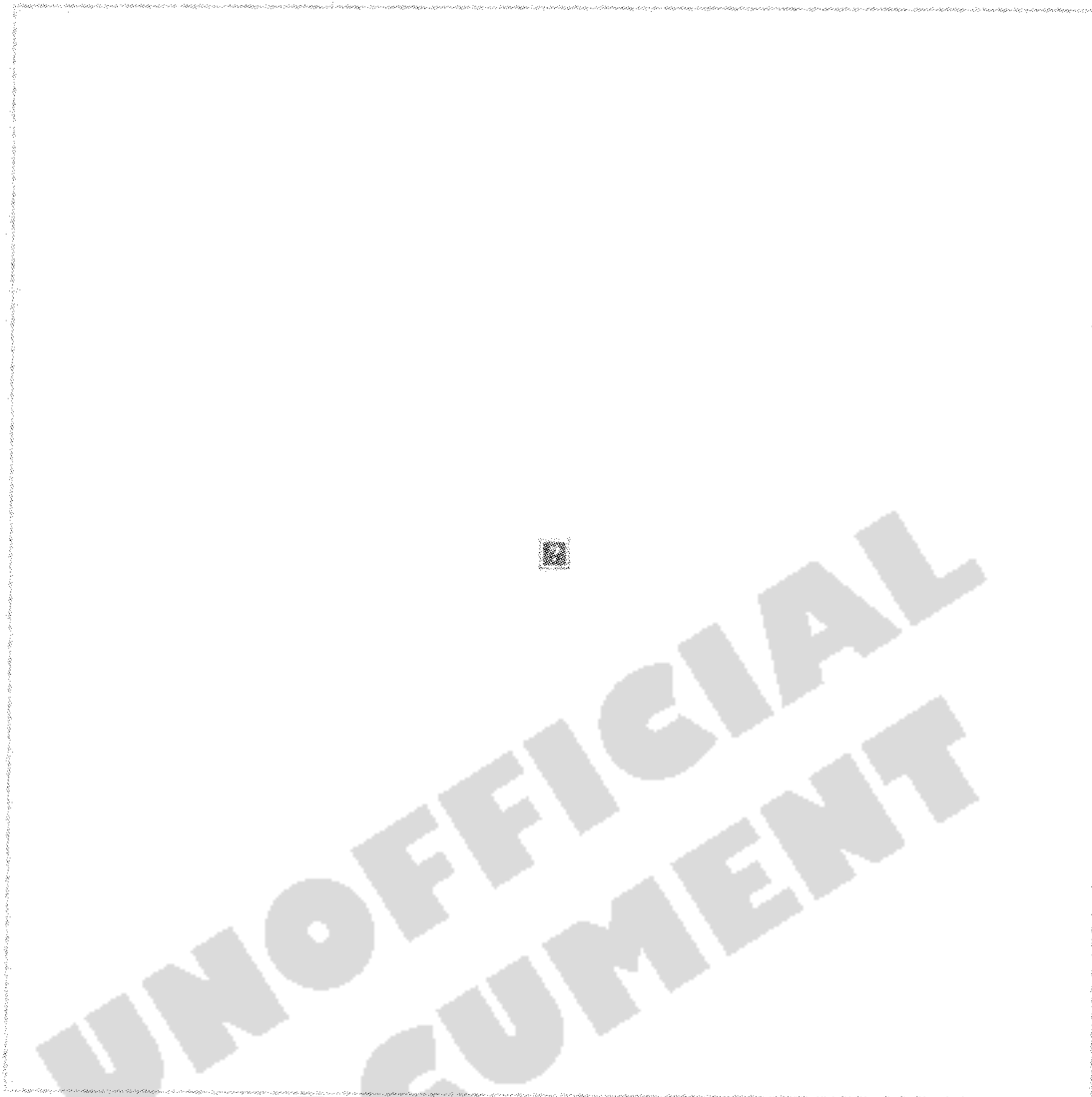

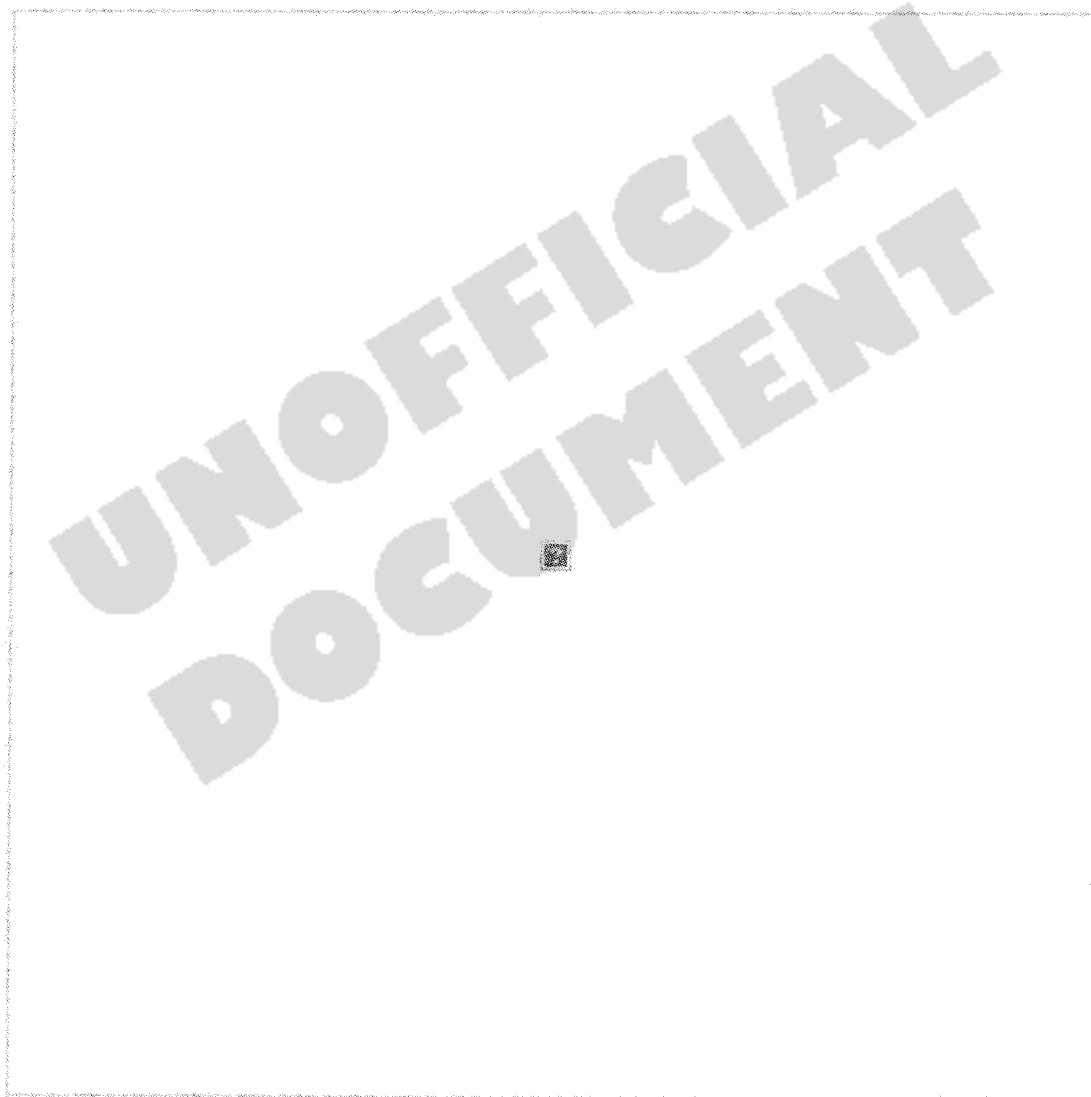

Open Letter to the FBI



Dear Florida Branch of the FBI,

My name is Chaz Galloway, and I am an investigative reporter based in Walton County, Florida.

Subject: New Suzanne Harris Theory

Hello Everyone,

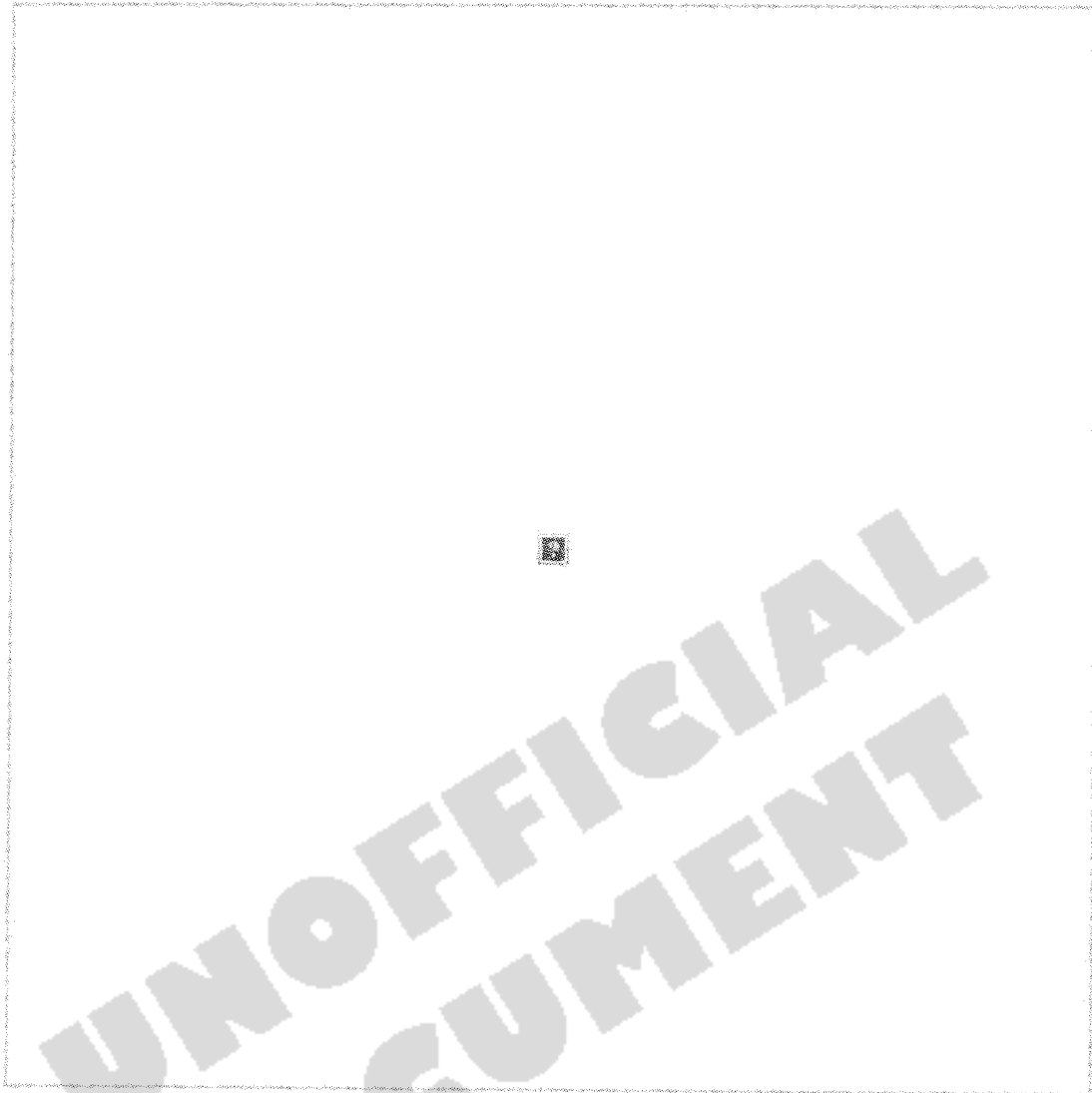

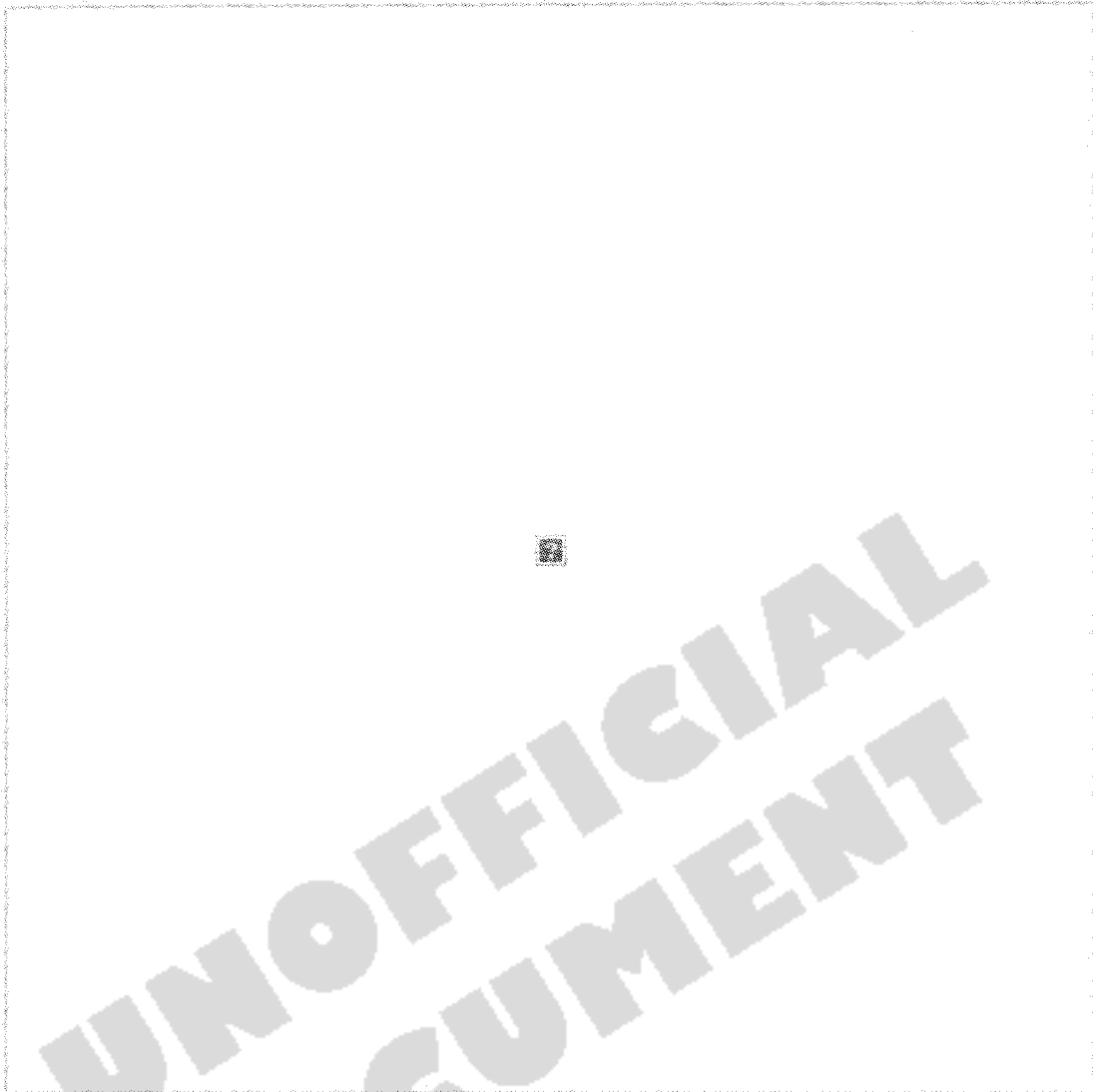

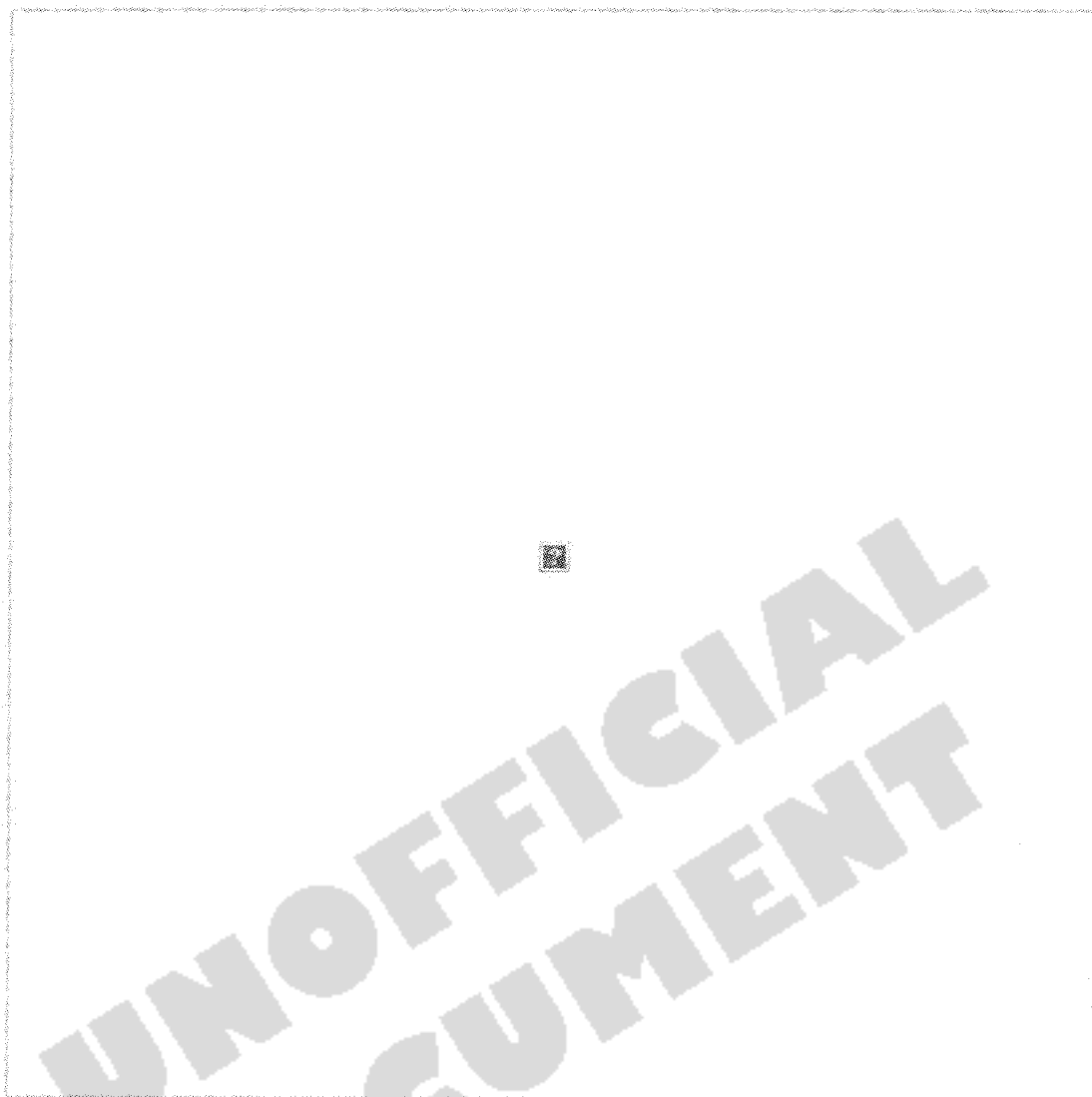

The specifics of these disagreements are still unclear, but the impact on the victims is undeniable.

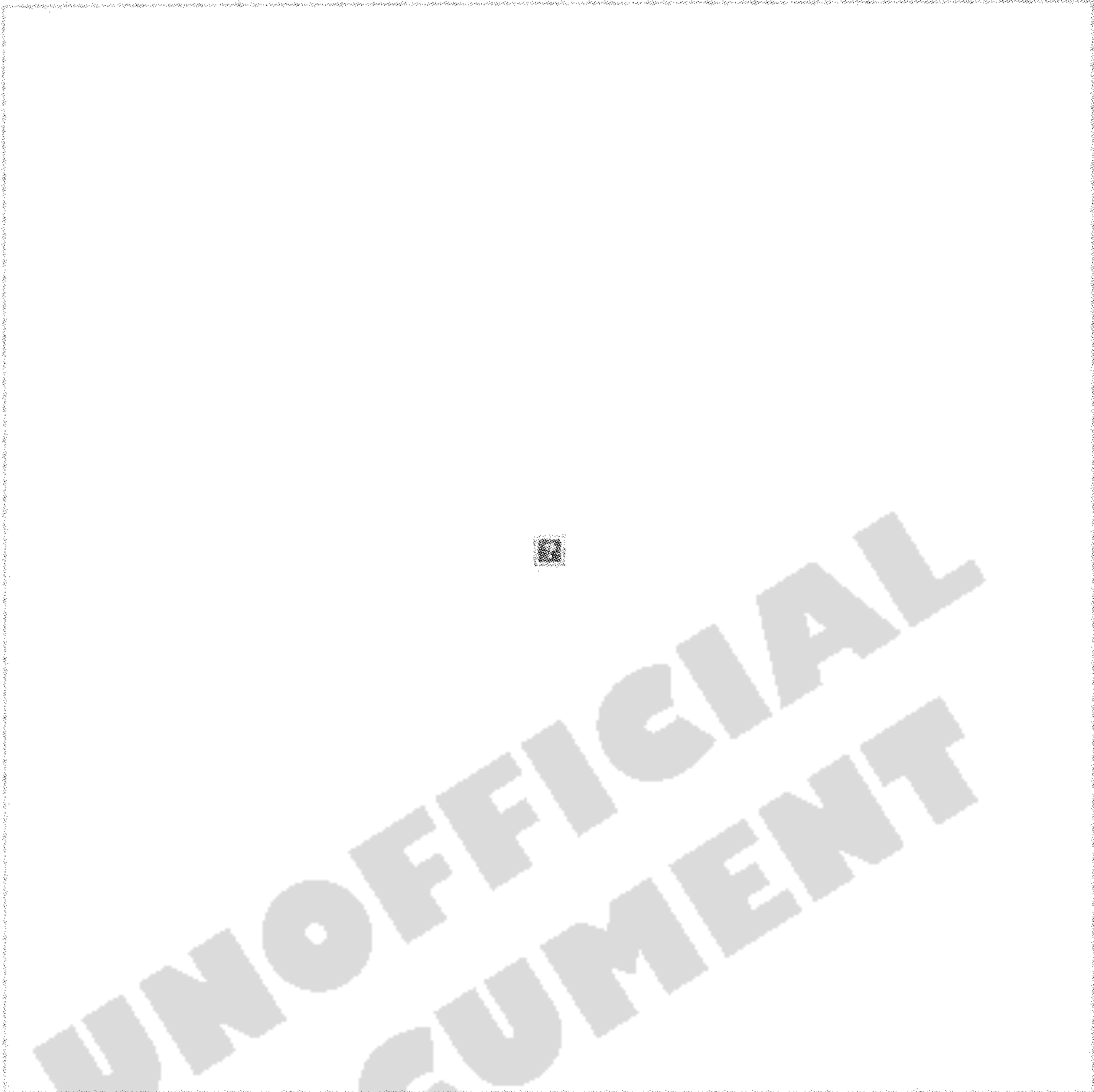
Authorities, including Deputy Blevins of the Walton County Sheriff's Office, are currently investigating the matter.

Legal protections, such as restraining orders and no-contact orders, are available through the Walton County Clerk of Courts Office.

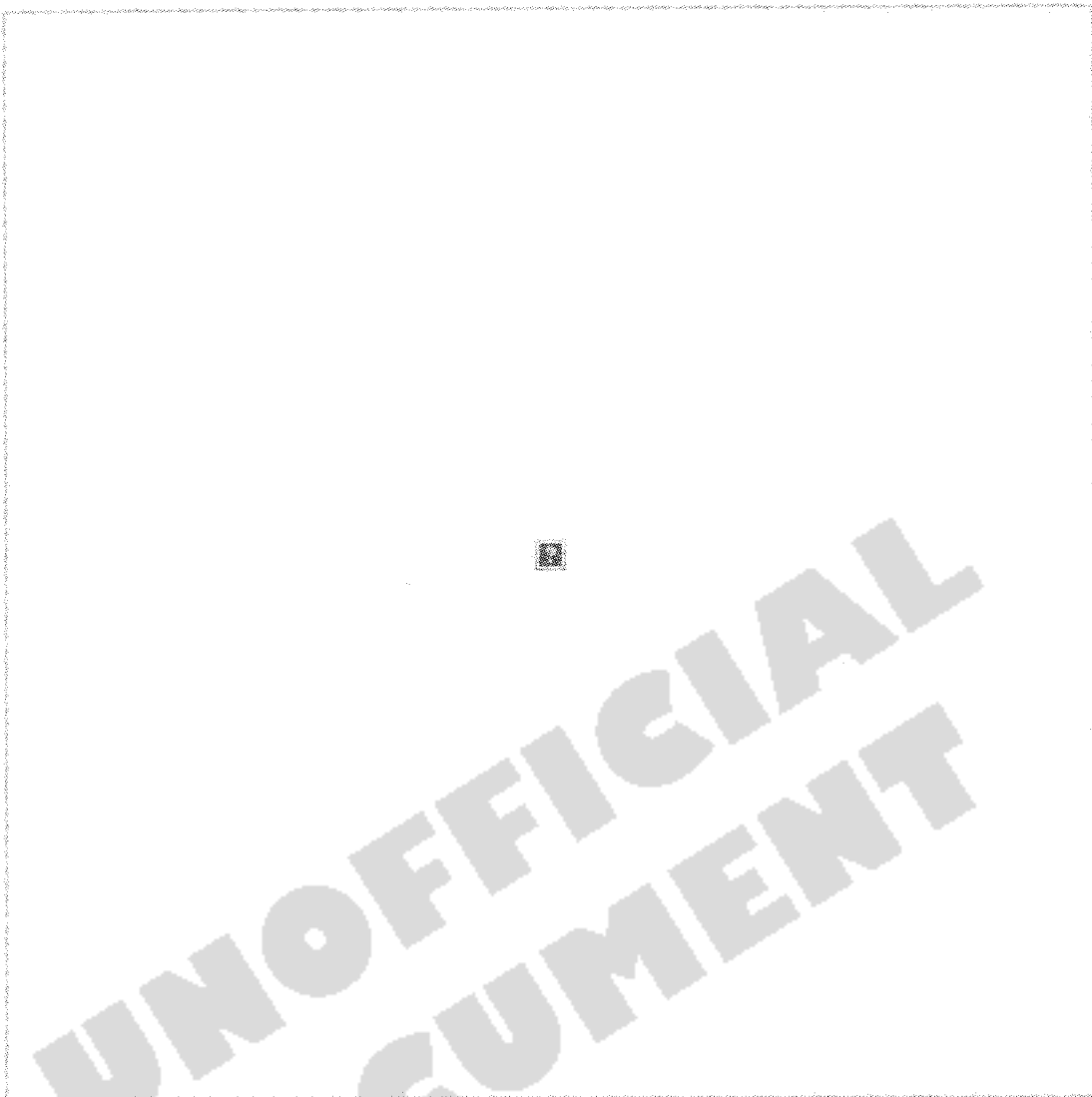

To fully grasp the gravity of this situation, we encourage you to listen to the voicemail he left—one that should give us all pause.

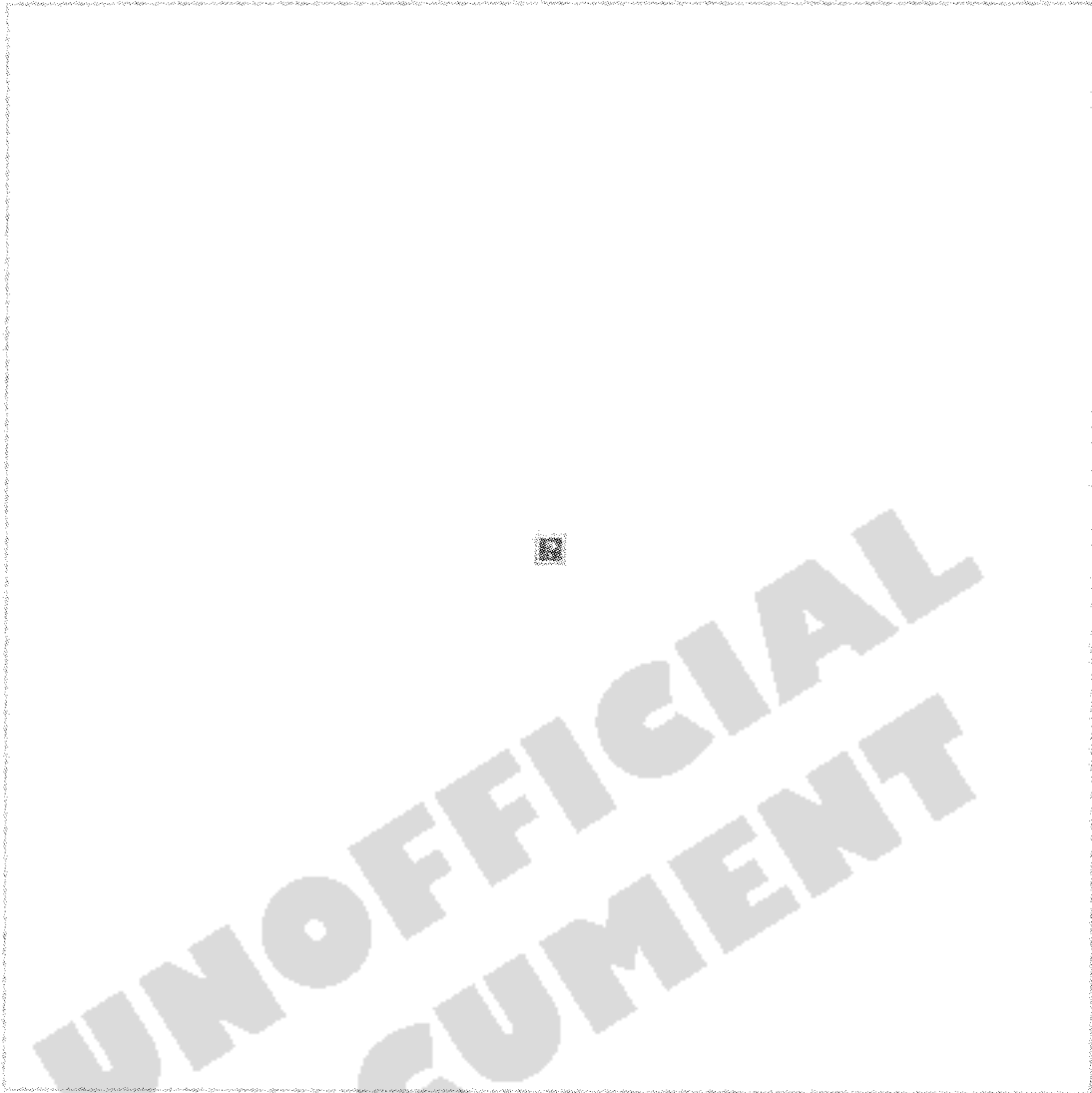
This isn't just about a political spat; it's about the kind of intimidation and fear tactics that have no place in our community.

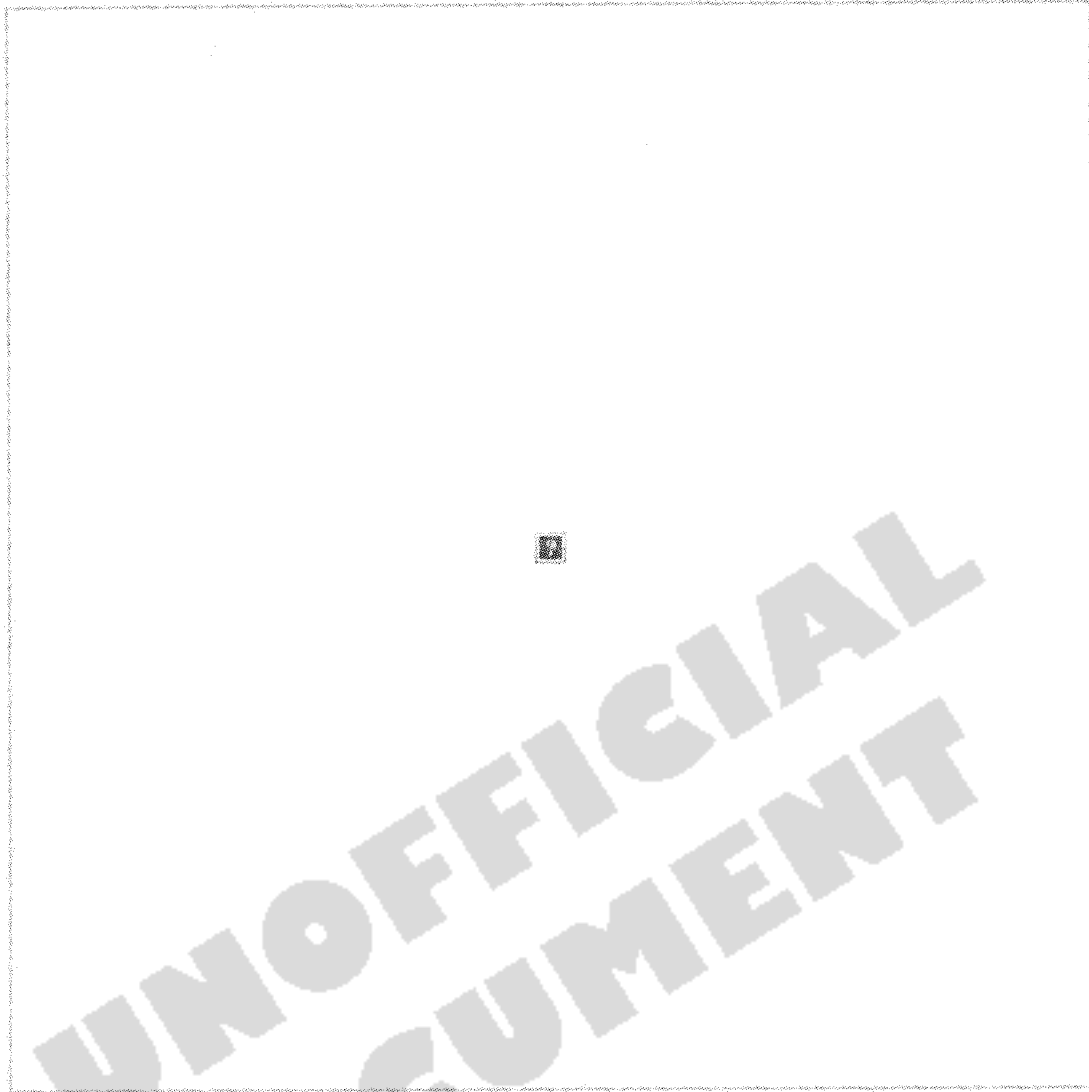


Is Hurricane Drake Coming to Walton County?!?!

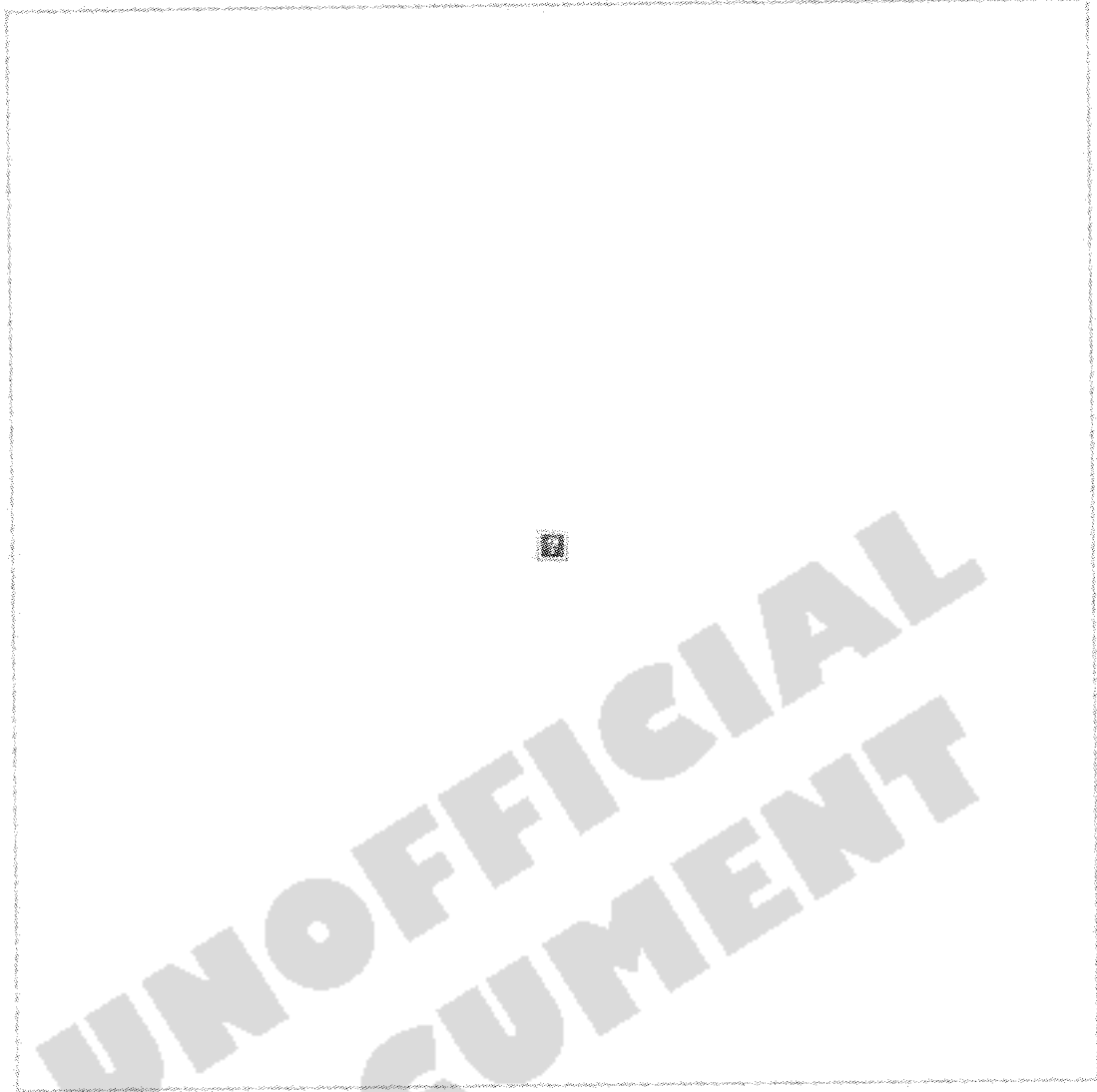
The song captures the essence of Nick's platform and serves as a reminder of what's at stake in this election.

As the Walton County election approaches, Galloway's song is sure to become an anthem for those who share Nick's passion for protecting and enhancing the area's natural resources.

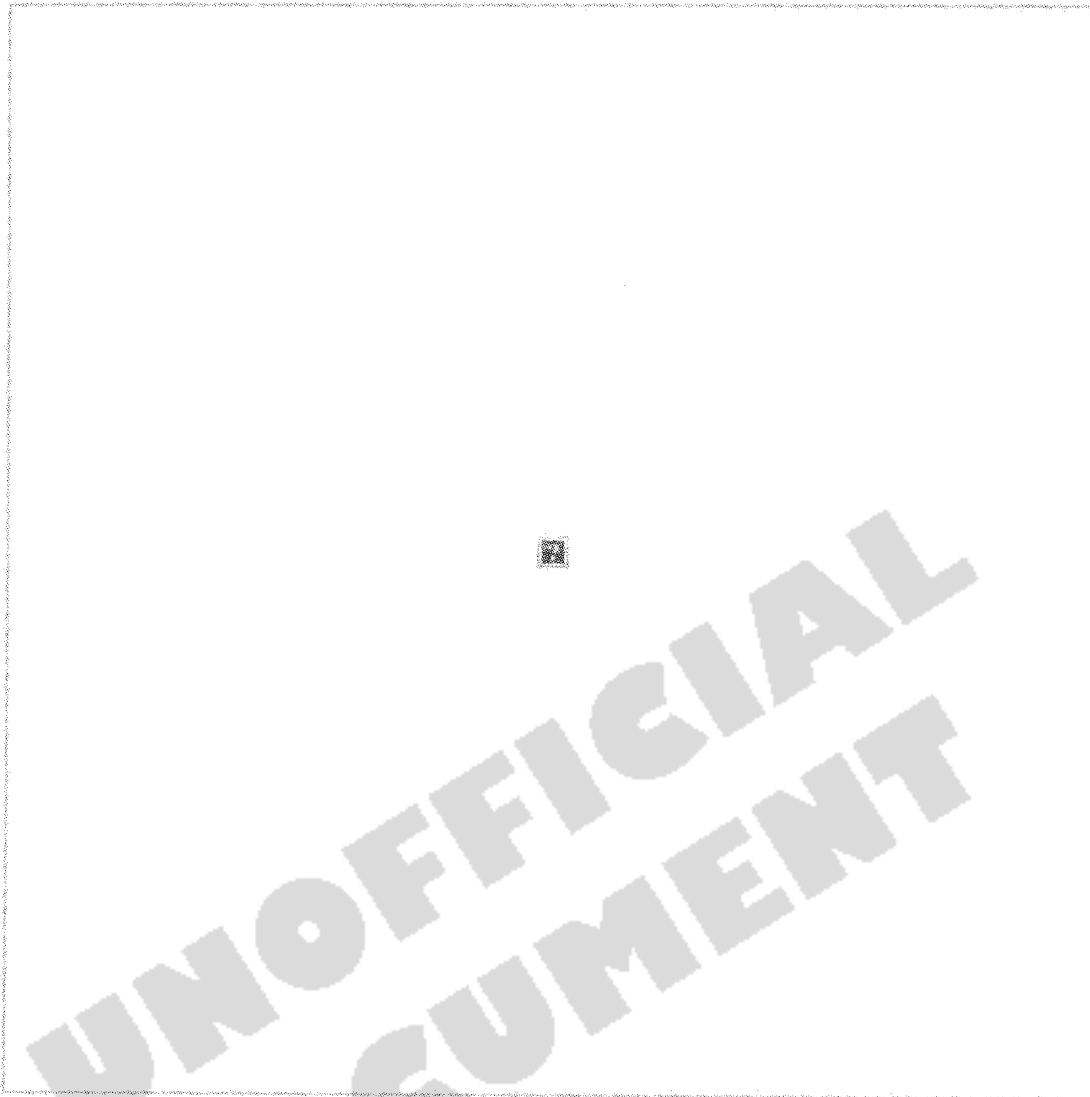

Galloway had previously criticized the company and its brokers for their involvement with Gulf front beach owners, particularly regarding their substantial market share in Gulf front property transactions.

Galloway is arguing that a HUGE conflict of interest exists between Scenic Sotheby's involvement in the privatization of walton county beaches, all while attempting to profit off the sale of gulf front parcels to Walton County using taxpayer funds.

In a recent encounter at a local Starbucks, Chris Abbott, a broker with Scenic Sotheby's, approached Galloway to express his respect for the podcast host's willingness to voice concerns about the company's role in these transactions.

Abbott acknowledged Galloway's efforts to bring attention to the relationship between Scenic Sotheby's and Gulf front beach owners.

However, Galloway admits that his criticisms may have been influenced by personal ethical and moral reservations about the company's significant earnings from these transactions.



He pointed out that Scenic Sotheby's holds a substantial market share of Gulf front listings and referenced a letter sent by the company's owners to E-CAR, urging them to stay out of the customary use political debate.

This debate revolves around the use of Gulf front beaches, a matter of ongoing public concern.

Galloway has expressed regret for publicly highlighting these issues, acknowledging that his actions may have been driven by a sense of paranoia, especially after facing what he describes as intimidation and surveillance by Walton County Officials that

according to FDLE two former county employees are set to be charged with third degree felonies.

"I realize now that my approach may have been overly critical and perhaps even misguided," Galloway said. "I apologize to Scenic Sotheby's and Chris Abbott for any distress my comments may have caused.

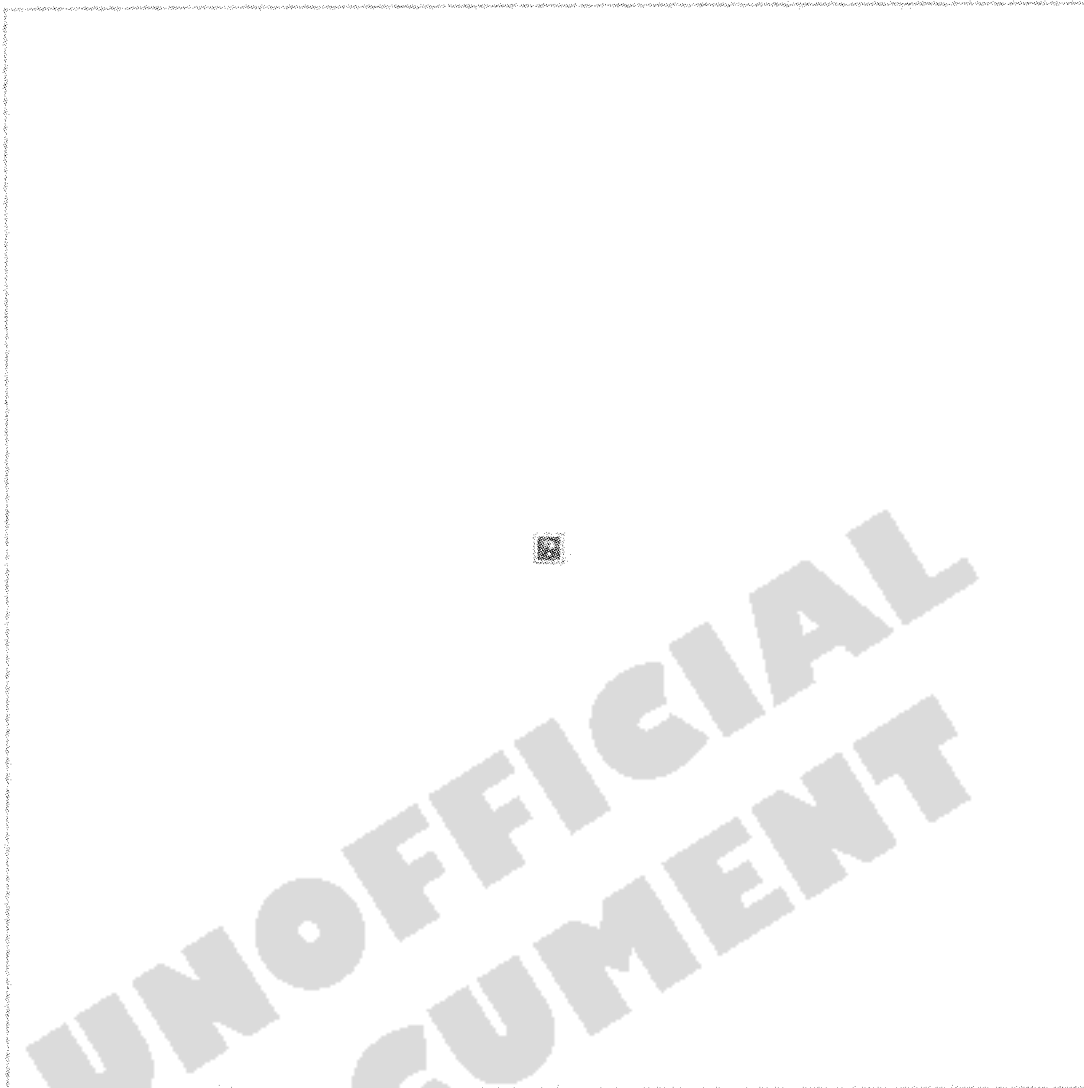
Upon reflection, I see that if the community isn't willing to stand up for the cause of public beaches, then maybe my stance was wrong.

Barbara Morano and Dan Curry deserve to be evaluated on their own merits and commitment to the community, not on unfounded associations.

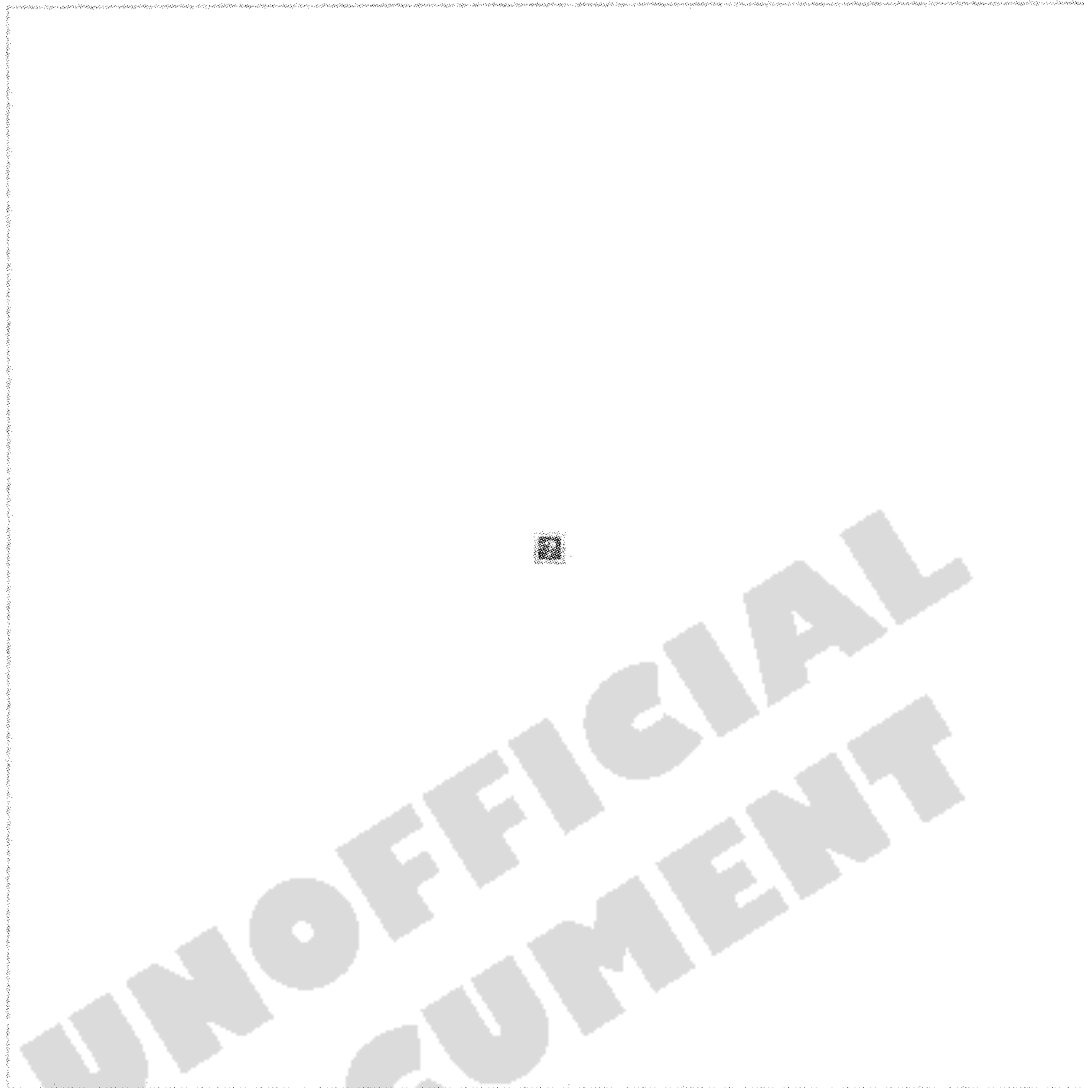
